The new program - ACE (Accessing Choices in Education) will be open to all Native American students attending school in Yerington High School and Yerington Intermediate School, 5th grade through 12th grade. It is very possible we may be able to provide anything your student may need to succeed educationally. We were awarded almost 3 million for a five-year program, this will cover a lot of needs.



## Paiute Language Class completed

The Paiute language at Yerington High School completed the four-week class held on Tuesdays and Thursdays. The class instruction was recorded and will eventually be put on the NYCP Yerington High and Intermediate Facebook private group page. This will enable students and their families to view the recording and learn the Paiute language at their leisure and comfort

of their homes.

Students were taught how to say sentences, were quizzed on what they learned, laughing and enjoying the time together with fellow students and



their instructor, Mr. Hunter. In the past the Paiute language was taught in the home, but today it's no longer taught by the parents at home. The elders are no longer around. Students learned the introduction of themselves in Paiute, repeating it several times to say it the proper way.

## NYCP Fishing Day #2 at the Lake





After several hours of fishing and staying warm, everyone enjoyed lunch in the vehicles due to the brisk cold wind.



## Learning the Art of Drum Stick Making







Yerington High School students took time out of their day on Tues. and Thurs., March 23 and 25 to learn how to make a drum stick. After completing their homework, they spent an hour on Tuesday to start the wrapping process of the drum stick. Each student was provided a bag of supplies they would be using for their own stick. Items included yarn, two kinds of tape to wrap around the stick, two heavy needles, sinew, two cut out buckskin pieces, and a heavy red twine..

Career and College Coach, Gerald Hunter, was the instructor, talking and assisting everyone to assure the supplies were being used properly. Students were eager and anxious to learn how to make a drum stick. Once the stick was completed wrapped with the two tapes, and yarn, the next process was the top buckskin to be sewn onto the drum stick head. First students had to separate the string of sinew to thread the needle and make it easier to go through the buckskin. This was not an easy thing to do as buckskin is very thick and it takes a lot of strength to push the needle through and then pull with the tool (pliers). Not everyone completed the drumsticks, but with teacher conferences set for the following week, students were allowed to take them home to complete.

### GET YOUR MAMMOGRAM TODAY!

- \* As technology improves, so do we. 3-D technology offers greater accuracy in mammography screening.
- Women 40 and over require NO referral.
   Women 39 and under, or men, MUST present a physician (PCP) referral.
- Must be at least 366 days since last screening.
- NO minors can be left unattended and they may NOT accompany you into the exam room.
- Results are mailed directly to you and your PCP / Specialist.

Please be sure you have all of the following with you upon arrival to ensure a smooth check in experience:

- Current and valid government-issued photo ID
- Current insurance card (if applicable)
- Mammography Patient Registration forms — please complete before your appointment (forms are available online at nvhealthcenters.org/ mammography)
- Name and phone number of your Primary Care Physician (PCP)

### Acceptable Methods of Payment:

- \* Call your insurance company to find out if 3-D is covered. If it is not covered, you have the option of purchasing this enhanced test at a cost of \$50.
- Medicare Medicaid Sliding Fee Scale
- Women's Health Connection (WHC)
- Most major insurances Yearly Preventive Screenings are covered under most insurances, however, verify your coverage prior to your appointment to assure the Mammovan is an accepted provider.
- Individuals NOT COVERED by health insurance may qualify for a "no charge" screening.


